Uniform

- Grey skirt or pinafore or grey trousers
- Navy jumper, cardigan or sweatshirt (available with school logo)
- White blouse/polo top/shirt
- White or grey socks or tights
- Navy school logo fleece
- Black shoes
- Blue gingham (checked) dress in summer

Uniform continued

PE uniform

- P.E. clothing is a **white t-shirt** and black shorts.
- For outdoors: black, navy or grey jogging bottoms/sweatshirt/tracksuit (not patterned inc. large writing) and black trainers.

All PE kit stays in school in a labelled bag.

Jewellery

- Children may wear a watch to school (*older year groups-not able to receive text messages etc*).
- Only small stud or sleeper earrings are acceptable for children with pierced ears.
- During P.E. lessons we expect your child to remove studs. Ideally your child will not wear earrings on PE days. This is the requirement laid down by the Education Authority.
- No other jewellery is allowed – this includes bands on wrists.

Please encourage your child to leave their mobile phone at home- they cannot be used in the school grounds. If you are collecting them, there is no reason for mobiles to be with them.

All items are brought into school are at your own risk. Therefore, please discourage your child from bringing anything to school that is not needed for their education.



Homework Expectations

- Weekly online homework set via SATs Companion – log-ins to follow
- Daily reading (at least five times per week) of their Oxford Reading Tree (levelled) book or a book for a pleasure. Please comment on your child's reading in their journal.
- Timetables Rockstars – daily until up to 12x12 is learnt.
- Your child will receive their log-ins again in the first/second week.
- Sometimes, extra homework may be set at a teacher's discretion. For example, half-term creative projects.



Year 5 Assessment

- During Year 5, we will begin using Year 5 tests, teacher assessment and past SATs papers to assess your child's progress.
- This is also used to analyse gaps in their learning which can be addressed in following lesson or through intervention.
- We will notify pupils of upcoming assessment weeks – please try your absolute best to ensure their attendance.
- Excellent practice for the challenge of Year 6.

Percentage	Days	Value
100% Attendance	0 days missed	Gives your child the best opportunity to make great progress.
95% Attendance	9 days' absence or 1 week and 4 days of missed learning.	
90% Attendance	19 days' absence or 3 weeks and 4 days of missed learning.	Makes it harder to learn and progress. Gaps in learning will be evident.
85% Attendance	29 days' absence or 5 weeks and 4 days of missed learning. Almost one half-term missed.	Will impact your child's progress significantly.
80% attendance	38 days' absence or 7 weeks and 3 days of missed learning.	Seriously impacts your child's learning and development.
75% Attendance	48 days' absence or 9 weeks and 6 days of missed learning.	

If your child has 90% attendance they will miss the equivalent of:
½ day per week
19 days a year
247 days over the 13 statutory years of education or 1 year and 10 weeks.



Punctuality

- School opens at 8:40am. Gates close at 8:55am. All children arriving after 8:55am will be marked late.
- Punctuality is important:
 - we all feel flustered if we are late - children do too.
 - everyone else is already settled and it makes it difficult to join part way through a lesson.
 - missing parts of lessons creates gaps in learning.



Attendance Process

- Children are expected to attend school every day unless they are unwell.
- If they are unwell, it is their parent's responsibility to inform the school by 9am, stating the reason for absence.
- To ensure the safety of all our pupils, if we have not been notified of a reason for absence, we will call you. If we can't make contact, a member of staff will visit your home.
- Due to the reasons outlined in the previous slides- if the child's attendance is not at least 96%, school will contact you so we can work together to improve attendance.
- Please plan routine appointments outside the school day wherever possible.
- The DFE have released new guidance regarding attendance, holidays will continue to be unauthorised and may result in a fine.
